

# *Tuition & Payment Option Information*

*2026-2027*

As a privately funded non-profit, Augustine Christian Academy relies heavily on the consistent tuition payment of our families to meet our monthly obligations for the payroll and operational expenses. We use a third-party payment processing company, FACTS, for semi-annual or monthly payment plans. Only those paying their tuition in full are to do so through our front office.

**PLEASE NOTE:** The tuition amount shown below includes books, computer and science lab fees, and matriculation. Part-time and full-time students may participate in all extracurricular activities. There are additional fees for secondary art classes and the performing arts program, as well as the Applied Sciences class.

## **School of Grammar**

(Pre-Kindergarten students must be 4 years old by August 31st. Kindergarten students must be 5 years old by August 31st. First Grade students must be 6 years old by August 31st.)

K4 – 5th Grade (Full-Time) \$9,650\* per year

(Part-Time, academic programs may be considered for our K4 program)

- 5-Day morning\*\* (8:00-lunch) program \$5,795\* per year

\*School of Grammar fees include classroom supplies, art fees, and the 5th Grade Junior Achievement BizTown program.

\*\*Other options are available. The morning option is recommended.

## **School of Dialect**

6th - 8th Grade (Full-Time) \$10,200 per year\*\*

- Part-Time Classes \$1,775 per class
- Full-time is considered enrollment in at least 6 classes
- Part-time enrollment is available up to 5 classes

## **School of Rhetoric**

9th – 12th Grade (Full-Time) \$11,200 per year

- Part-Time Classes \$1,875 per class/per year
- Full-time is considered enrollment in 6 classes
- Part-time enrollment is available up to 5 classes

**A non-refundable \$100 enrollment deposit per family is due when the student is enrolled and will be applied to tuition upon completion of enrollment. Tutoring sessions available on a per diem basis.**

## **Financial Assistance Information:**

Multiple child discounts for students enrolled full-time: 2nd child -3% discount; 3rd child or more- 10% discount each. Families with full-time students may apply for financial aid using **Facts Grant and Aid Assessment**. There is a limited amount of financial aid available each year. Financial aid applications can be submitted online at [online.factsmgt.com/aid](http://online.factsmgt.com/aid). Financial aid flyers are available in the school office. FACTS will make a recommendation as to need, but by board directive financial assistance may not exceed 50% (exceptions may apply). Tuition Assistance recipients must apply first for the Parental Choice Tax Credit (approval is not required, just application)

## **Tuition Payment Options:**

Payment in full- a 2% discount is available to those who pay the full year's tuition by June 30th. Multiple payment options from 2 to 12 payments-available only through FACTS Tuition Management, a payment processing company. ACA is not able to offer the options of monthly payments without using FACTS. If you plan to pay your tuition using the FACTS payment options, a plan must be set up online at [online.factsmgt.com/signin/4CT43](http://online.factsmgt.com/signin/4CT43). Any changes to your FACTS payment plan must be transacted in the school office. Payments are to be completed by May of the school year (exceptions may apply).

12-month plan: Payments start in May or June.

11-month plan: Payments start in June or July.

10-month plan: Payments start in July or August.

# *Frequently Asked Questions*

Q: What is Classical Education?

A: Classical Education is designed to make connections. It focuses on history, literature, logic, languages, and thinking skills. The goal of Christian classical education is to prompt the learner to view the world around them and their place in it in light of Scripture. Educationally, classical education uses the Trivium approach to learning—a method that customizes learning approaches according to the logical needs and desires of students' ages and capabilities.

Q: How long has Augustine Christian Academy been around?

A: The school was founded in 1997 with 23 students. Since then, God has blessed us with steady growth, a dedicated campus, and increasing public awareness.

Q: Why is it named Augustine Christian Academy? Is it a Catholic school?

A: We are not affiliated with any particular church or denomination. St. Augustine of Hippo was one of the earliest and most adamant supporters of classical education and taught that learning should make connections. Our name calls remembrance to Augustine's stand for the study of truth and seeks to remind others and us "Ideas have consequences."

Q: How is Augustine Christian Academy organized?

A: We are organized as St. Augustine Academy, Inc., dba Augustine Christian Academy, a 501(c)3, non-profit educational institution under the control of a Board of Governors. The Board sets policy and oversees the daily operations of the school through the administration.

Q: Is there a dress code?

A: Students wear uniforms to school, which includes a daily uniform and special uniforms for "high convocation." Approved spirit wear is expected for extra-curricular activities. We believe in valuing one another based on character instead of externals, and uniforms help keep our focus on that. Q: Do you offer art or music?

A: Classical education is steeped in art, music, and literature. We have a vibrant Fine Arts program, and are well known in our community for our annual Christmas Programs and all-school plays.

Q: What is the Trivium?

A: Trivium is simply a Latin term for "three," but it means more than that. Trivium refers to the three schools at ACA – Grammar, Dialectic, and Rhetoric. It is an educational approach that is steeped in history and that is dedicated to approaching learning in the way each age group of students in each school typically learns best. Latin, logic, history, literature, and Bible are all integrated in this approach so that the students learn to make connections among them.
